# CONFERENCE SPEAKERS

## **John-Michael and Ellen Keyes**

represents The "I Love U Guys" Foundation to districts, departments, agencies and organizations regarding school safety. His professional career has included graphic design, software development, and workflow analysis. The death of his daughter, Emily, at Platte Canyon High School compelled Mr. Keyes to bring his professional expertise to the arena of school safety. The Keyes family's response to the events at Platte Canyon High School was immediate support for first responders and compassionate outreach to law enforcement. The Keyes hope these direct and positive actions can act as a guidepost for families impacted by violence.

The "I Love U Guys" Foundation is introducing **"The Standard Response Protocol (SRP)"**. SRP is based not on individual scenarios but on the response to any given scenario. Like the Incident Command System, SRP demands a specific vocabulary but also allows for great flexibility.

Lockout is the protocol used to secure the building's outside perimeter; Lockdown is the protocol used to secure individual rooms and keep students quiet and in place; Evacuate is always followed by a location, and is used to orderly move students and staff from one location to a different location in or out of the building; Shelter is the protocol for self protection, and is always followed by a method. With a combination of both humor and heart, the presentation includes powerful reminders of both the importance of school safety and the recognition that no school is immune to emergency events.

## **Det. Mike Paul, Dr. Dawn LeBlanc**

**"Identification of Potentially Violent Students Case Study Review, Safe Campus Concepts"**

Too often in the media we hear the horror stories and "reactions" to school violence. Often these incidents are the result of a lack of prevention and intervention. All school populations require vigilance when it comes to providing a safe school climate. This presentation will discuss current research relative to at-risk students, provide interactive case studies and provide an example of a basic "tool" personnel can use to assist in the identification process.

Detective Paul has lectured in colleges, law enforcement training academies and at national school safety conferences for the past three years. Paul has nineteen years experience in law enforcement, the past seven involving school issues. TPD has a non-traditional SRO approach working with North Penn High and North Montco Tech Center. Dr. LeBlanc has been pro-active on safe school initiatives in Montgomery County. She serves on both County and State wide Safe and Drug Free Schools committee, State Safe School Advisory Committee, and has formed a North Montgomery County Safe Schools Committee as well a numerous local safe school committees.

## **Captain Tomas Sanchez** **Hollywood Police Dept., Florida**

**"Juvenile Delinquency Prevention & Intervention Programs"** Capt. Tomas Sanchez has more than twenty three years of law enforcement experience. In his current managerial position his responsibilities have included directing and controlling such major segments of the Police Department as Patrol, Special Operations, Criminal Investigations, HIDTA Task Force, and Support Services of the department. Tom has served in a wide variety of assignments. He has supervised high risk units such as SWAT, Hostage Negotiators, K-9, Field Force, Narcotics and Street Crimes.

He has specific expertise in research, grants, promotional testing, juvenile justice and crisis planning. Mr. Sanchez has conceptualized, organized and conducted some of the largest full scale School Active Shooter exercises in the nation. He has traveled the country training fellow officers.

Tom is a graduate of Senior Police Institute for Management by PERF, Southern Police Institute Command Officers Course in Louisville, KY and has over 5,500 hours of advanced career development. He holds a Master of Science in Criminal Justice Administration and a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration. He is an accomplished author in national periodicals and co-wrote a Management Symposium Manual.

Her law enforcement career included working as a patrol officer, investigations, community policing, Administrator of Firearms Licensing for Police Officers and Private Citizens, school resource officer and a detective in domestic violence and juvenile safety.
